Notes to the Abbreviated Accounts for the period ended 30 November 2013**1 Accounting Policies****Basis of measurement and preparation of accounts**

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities effective April 2008.

Turnover policy

Turnover represents the value, net of value added tax and discounts, of goods provided to customers and work carried out in respect of services provided to customers.

Other accounting policies**Work in progress**

Work in progress is valued on the basis of long term contracts, in line with guidance set out in UITF 40. The company classifies as long term contracts where the activity extends over more than one accounting period. The amount recognised as turnover represents the amount of work carried out in the period. Where the outcome of a contract can be assessed with reasonable certainty, attributable profit is recognised in proportion to the amount of turnover in the accounts. Full provision is made for any foreseeable losses. Long term Contract balances are included in the balance sheet at net cost, less foreseeable losses, and included in debtors under amounts recoverable on contracts.
